

tions was the moving presentation of Thornton Wilder's "Our Town" in 1950, which netted the PLAYERS \$400 toward a new curtain for the Auditorium. This remains in a special account, earmarked for the purpose until it can be augmented. On the anniversary performance of "Death Takes A Holiday," the PLAYERS share proceeds with the College club, planning to use their returns for much needed stage equipment.

The first half decade of the PLAYERS' history were growing years, packed with much successful experimentation, increasing approbation by the public, and plenty of fun. A total of 12 different full-evening performances was given, along with a number of repeat performances both here and out-of-town. Small groups gave one-act plays, or skits, under various auspices, in various communities. Meetings during this period were often characterized by play reading, so that all PLAYERS could gain experience and psychological insight by taking turns at different roles.

During these years the PLAYERS were "on their own." They were feeling their way, in matters of acting, stagecraft, and direction. The PLAYERS themselves took turns as directors, and much work of an experimental nature was accomplished. Direction now has come a long way since the period in which directors were little more than prompters. These early years are filled with delightful memories for those older in membership.

Mishaps occurred. Recruits for the casts of plays—from the beginning non-PLAYERS have contributed much time and talent to productions—sometimes chose not to learn their lines until the night of the performance, like as not confounding the rest of the cast when they did have them letter perfect. Far from absent was a spirit of tomfoolery which too often made a play more humorous than intended for both cast and audience.

In the fall of 1932, however, a chapter closed, and a new one opened. The PLAYERS decided to engage a professional coach for "Peg O' My Heart," to benefit the College club in November.

That coach was Veroqua Sheldon Lovgren, wife of the rector of St. Paul's church, Rev. Bernard Lovgren. For 10 years, until the Lovgrens moved to California, Mrs. Lovgren was the guiding spirit of the PLAYERS, their severest, but most enthusiastic, critic, their kind friend and champion. Certainly she gave limitlessly to the group of her great talent, her boundless energy, and her deep affection.

No detail of production, or of direction, was neglected by Mrs. Lovgren. Realism was her philosophy of play production, realism in interpretation, realism in settings and properties. In preparation for a play Mrs. Lovgren read deeply of the author's works, studying the playwright so thoroughly she had no hesitation in insisting on her views of his intention in a given passage. "Her understanding of characterization was a quality invaluable to the PLAYERS."

If the play had an English setting no Boston newspaper was a jarring note. Real books filled the bookcases, not cardboard facades. For one play she even sent to England for the marron glacés called for in the script.

Success of "Peg O' My Heart" assuring the PLAYERS of their great good fortune in securing Mrs. Lovgren's help, the PLAYERS went on that year to give two more plays. The second, "Death Takes a Holiday," was such a triumph that the PLAYERS chose it for their 25th anniversary performance. It was first presented May 2, 1933, and, for the record, the original cast was composed of Miss Helen Remiek, Gordon Kimball, Harold Cheney, Miss Dolly Smith, Miss Iyla Tracy (now Mrs. Bonnez), Mrs. Beulah Bean, Kenison Hill, Miss Joan Ransom (Mrs. Albert Pickhardt), Winslow Osborne, Edward W. Crawford, Miss Margaret O' Leary, Arthur Bean and Harold Owen.

During the first year, beginning in fact with "Peg O' My Heart," Mrs. Lovgren's innovations included inauguration of public tryouts. This practice continues today, with interested persons given equal opportunity with the PLAYERS to try out for a play.

Frequently, members of casts chosen in this way become ardent members of the PLAYERS, sharing tasks of production, no matter how "unglamorous," along with the others. It must be noted that there is no chore of play production with which a PLAYER fails to become acquainted, or to perform with enthusiasm. The painting of sets, the tireless dredging of attics and cellars for properties and costumes, all are part of The Play; and he who plays king in one show is crossing tender in the next, or without a role at all, save the backstage one of shifting scenery or manipulating lights. This practice, the organization feels, is good both for production and morale. As a matter of fact, a certain percentage of the membership never aspires to treading the boards, fulfilling the desire to be of the theater family by working on costumes, designing sets, or helping with make-up.

Also stressed by Mrs. Lovgren in her direction was the importance of each player, no matter how trivial his part. Each studied his role with great attention to detail until its interpretation was perfect in her eyes. For the more important role, no effort was too great. For the ambitious undertaking of "Twelfth Night," for example, on February 11, 1938, Harold Cheney and Winslow Osborne in the roles of Sir Toby Belch and Sir Andrew Aguecheek, took private lessons in fencing from a master at St. Paul's school.

Mrs. Lovgren molded the group into a disciplined whole, until the point when even she saw them changed from "earnest amateurs to professionals." Under her tutelage each learned every facet of stagecraft, until a reasonably large number was able to—and does—carry on capable direction. To be sure, even in Mrs. Lovgren's day, not every play met with unqualified approval; William Pitt of the Concord Monitor staff at that time said of "Another Language"

(November 16, 1934) that "the performance was unforgettable because it shared the not altogether unique distinction of being almost everything it shouldn't be." Mr. Pitt's famous judgment in the matter notwithstanding, criticism of the plays, both oral and published, has been largely laudatory both before and since his time. Yet it would not be quite true history should not this particular review, which occasioned much commotion at the time, not be recalled.

Before the Lovgrens departure for the coast Mrs. Lovgren was to enjoy another triumph, of many. This was the performance of "Ladies in Retirement" on February 10, 1942. The triumph was many-faceted; two elements were the record-breaking and not-to-be-surpassed amount of proceeds for the Red Cross; the other was the presence of Miss Bette Davis in the audience, who fulsomely praised the performance, telling Mrs. Lovgren she had accomplished a "marvelous" task. There were no vacant seats; and proceeds were nearly \$800 for the cause.

Prepared by Mrs. Lovgren's close instruction in all phases of production, having had the benefit in some cases of private instruction by her, the PLAYERS were now ready to forge ahead by themselves. Successes have been many, and there have been frequent innovations in types of production and stagecraft.

One of the most ambitious—and one of the most successful—departures from custom was the performance of an original musical play, "Winner Take All," by Alyah and Alison Sulloway, now of Darien, Conn. This colorful show, which plotted a controversy between "summer people" and the "natives," had as leads Audrey Graham and Richard Bailey, who were supported by a tremendous cast. Lyrics by Mr. Sulloway, to music by Mrs. Sulloway, were hugely enjoyed. Few will ever forget the antics of Dr. Strong in "I'm Just an Old Reactionary," to mention only one of the bright moments. Music was by the New Hampshire Symphony Orchestra, under the direction of Paul Bauguss, music instructor at St. Paul's school.

"Winner Take All," the only major original work ever attempted publicly by the group, was presented nine times in the state. Its two performances at the city Auditorium were packed. It was given under the auspices of Grace and Kurt Graff at Meadow Hearth in Hopkinton the following summer. Other performances were given upon request in Nashua, Keene, Laconia, and Dover.

As a rule, the PLAYERS themselves have directed their own productions. There have been notable exceptions, however. Grace and Kurt Graff were directors upon two occasions, with "Alice in Wonderland" December 16 and 17, 1949, and "I Remember Mama," October 10, 1950.

Several years ago the PLAYERS added to their stature by joining the American National Theatre Academy (ANTA), which exists on a national basis for the continuance of all branches of the theatre.

They belong through the New England Theatre Conference, the division of the organization for this area. Through this means they reap the benefit of exchange of ideas through a wide area.

No history would even approach being well rounded did it fail to list the presidents who have guided the PLAYERS throughout its quarter century of existence. For the record, then, they have been Dr. Harry O. Barnes, Harold Cheney, Earl Hewitt, Arthur Bean, Francis Crowley, Edward W. Crawford, Frank Merrill, Dr. Osmond R. Strong, Winslow Osborne, Richard Bailey, Fred Ordway, Ruth Osborne, Irving Soden, George Huntley and Harriet Strong.

It must not be assumed that the officers carry the full burden of executive work alone, however. One most important task performed in committee must not be neglected. Each Spring a play-reading committee is appointed, to saturate itself during the summer with plays which might be suitable for presentation. Though many must be read, various factors narrow the choice. For example, one-set plays are favored, since excessive scene shifting must be avoided by so small a group, for obvious reasons.

Two other developments of recent years deserve special mention. First are the workshop plays, short plays to be given for experience, before a limited public, by groups within the group. The other is the Junior Workshop, for children and teen-agers. These young people help behind the scenes, act in mob scenes and choruses, stage plays and parts of plays before small audiences, take minor—and occasionally major—roles, in major performances. Among these COMMUNITY PLAYERS of the future are Julie Strong, Megan Owen, Richard, David and Stephen Bailey, Frank Pickhardt, Frank Mullen, and Barbara Shute.

From an original charter membership of 13, COMMUNITY PLAYERS has grown to an active group of approximately 60 individuals who love the theatre enough to give it plenty of energy and almost all their spare time. Stout individualists though its members are—those in the arts usually have this characteristic—temperament rarely obtrudes, and factionalism is absent. The PLAYERS form a disciplined and enthusiastic organization which has contributed inestimably to the cultural life of Concord, and attracted much favorable interest elsewhere in the state.





THE CONCORD COMMUNITY PLAYERS OF CONCORD, N.H. INC.

Statistics mount and climb, in forty years, to almost unbelievable heights. For instance, over seven hundred people, living in and about the Concord area have appeared in more than one hundred and twenty Community Players productions. Some have appeared in forty or more, others have only braved the boards once, preferring the anonymity of the darkened area backstage to that place behind the foots.

Nor have all lived so very near Concord. It is not unusual for a cast to have many out-of-towners but one young lady commuted from Plymouth, N. H. for a chorus part in "Oklahoma!" and only missed one rehearsal.

Consider what goes into a Community Player's production. The President and the Board of Directors appoint a Play Reading Chairman who, in turn, selects his Committee. This Committee reads plays that have been recommended by directors and members, hold meetings and discussions and turn over to the Board a list of suggested selections. These are examined for approval by the Board and the people who will direct the next season's choices.

Once selected, the director studies his play and holds tryouts for it. These tryouts are always open to the public, anyone can try for and win a part — it is not necessary to be a member of the Players. Suppose you try and win a part. The Director schedules rehearsals and you are on your way. For a three-act play, five weeks or more are used, rehearsals falling on three or four nights a week, depending upon the size of your part. A musical rehearses for at least eight weeks.

During this rehearsal period the Scenic Designer has a

crew building the set, the Prop committee is chasing mooseheads or wheel chairs or authentic left-handed Buddha gongs, Make-up figures its needs and orders the greasepaint and/or pancake and Costumes take measurements and sizes.

Hours and hours are spent blocking, working, changing and setting. A frantic attempt to learn the lines, handle the props, remember the business, polish the timing, increase the tempo, work with the costumes, set the dances and put the lyrics across — all at once — helps you forget the buzz saws and hammers in the background or that you're rehearsing in a cold room and haven't had a coffee break yet.

Finally the lines are down — well, most of them are down. The set is up, except for the staircase. Props have to get only three more items. But all the costumes have been o.k.'d — except for the Ingenue's ball gown for the fourth scene in Act Two. And we do have two more rehearsals. The Director has stopped making jokes and wears an expression that can only be described as "set." Ticket sales could be better but a big Box Office sale is expected, and everyone is confident that the leading lady's bout with laryngitis will be won by show night. From here on you exist on sheer fear alone.

Then, suddenly, someone is yelling "Ten minutes!" and it's show night. The Payoff. This is the reason for all the work and time and worry. Your hands are cold and clammy, you wait in the wings breathless and you can't remember your first line. There's your cue and someone is on stage, saying your lines. You realize, in a dreamy sort of way, that it's you. Then you feel it — the weird, magic, undefinable thrill of "doing the show". You're hooked now! You'll go through the hours and work and

worry again and again because the performance makes it all worthwhile.

What kind of person can go through all this, time and time again, and call it fun? All kinds, many kinds. A Salesman, a Lawyer, a Housewife, a Teacher, a Merchant, a Student, a City Official, a Doctor, a Typist, a Bookkeeper, a Nurse, a Minister may join hands for the Curtain Call. Soldiers, Beauticians, Waitresses, Laborers, Mothers, Barbers, Truck Drivers may build the sets, pull the curtain, design the lighting, fly the scrim and tie off the flats. They are all here — Actors, Crew, Directors, Plays — forty years of them.

We, the Players, have enjoyed them. We're ready for forty more. Won't you join us?
