The Transfer Station is available to Concord residents and commercial establishments. Concord residents can drop-off recycling for free with proof of residency (license). Waste will be weighed at the weigh station to determine rates (cash or credit accepted, no checks).

Drop-Off Rates:

Trash, Furniture, Metal	\$105 per ton. (\$10 minimum charge under 160 lbs.)
Municipal Solid Waste (Non-Residents & Commercial)	\$125 per ton. (\$10 minimum charge under 160 lbs.)
Construction Demolition Debris	\$125 per ton. (\$10 minimum charge under 160 lbs.)
Appliances Not Containing CFCs	\$125 per ton. (\$10 minimum charge under 160 lbs.)
Appliances Containing CFCs	\$25 per item.
Televisions & Monitors	\$20 per item.
Mattresses	\$10 per item.
Propane Tanks	\$12 per item.

Accepted Recycling Items:

Glass, tin, aluminum, plastic (1 through 7 - no plastic bags), newspaper, mixed paper, and corrugated cardboard. Mixed paper items include junk mail, construction paper, binder paper, computer paper, brown grocery bags, telephone books, manila folders, tissue and paper towel rolls, food boxes, envelopes, postcards, magazines, paperboard, boxes, paper egg cartons, etc.

All recycling is now single-stream and can all be placed into the single-stream bin, except corrugated cardboard, which should be placed in the cardboard containers.

Non-Accepted Recycling Items:

The recycle center does not accept plastic bags, Styrofoam, household batteries, chemicals, paint, or yard waste.

Other Acceptable Items:

Please see the attendant for items such as tires, motor oil, anti-freeze, thermostats, thermometers, automotive batteries, cell phones, and fluorescent bulbs (up to 6 small bulbs for no charge; fee after 6 bulbs).

Donations:

There is no charge for Concord residents to donate clothes (pants, shirts, shoes, and coats/jackets) in to the "Planet Aid" Container or books, CDs, DVDs, and VHS tapes into the "Got Books" Container.
