- b. Referral from Councilor Kretovic regarding constituent concerns with on-street parking along Sewalls Falls Road near Beaver Meadow School that interferes with Sewalls Falls Road through-travel during school pick-up times.
- c. Inquiry from Councilor Kenison regarding a constituent concern on pavement condition along S. Spring Street and the possibility of switching on street parking from the northbound side to the southbound side.
 - a. Discuss accident data in response to a concern from a resident about an increase in the traffic accidents at the intersection of Green, South, and Pleasant Streets.
