Overnight Fires Displaces Residents

CONCORD, NH (April 27, 2021) – Concord Fire Department received a fire alarm activation for 29 Bog Road at 11:39 p.m. on Monday night. As companies were being dispatched, Concord Fire Alarm started to receive multiple calls for a fire in Building 2. Companies arrived on scene of the 24-unit apartment building to find fire showing from the second floor, third floor, and attic. Companies quickly went to work to evacuate the remaining occupants of the building and attack the fire. Several pets were rescued by firefighters. A second alarm was transmitted to bring additional fire companies from Boscawen, Bow, Chichester, Franklin, Loudon, Pembroke, and Penacook Ambulance to the scene as well as additional communities to cover empty stations in the City. One occupant was transported to Concord Hospital to be treated for smoke inhalation. Two firefighters were injured battling the blaze. One was treated for second degree burns and one firefighter injured his knee. Due to the amount of damage to the building, none of the units were able to be reoccupied. The fire remains under investigation at this time, but does not appear to be related to any other recent fires in the City. This incident occurred during an already busy shift. Concord Fire personnel had already responded to 37 incidents, including: 20 requests for EMS, nine outside fires, several fire alarm activations, and a motor vehicle accident.
