City of Concord reaches agreement on 2015 ADA voting case

Concord, NH – On February 26, 2019, the City of Concord, New Hampshire reached an agreement with the United States Department of Justice to resolve a complaint which alleged that the City violated Title II of the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) in not providing an accessible voting machine to a blind voter during the November 2015 City election.

The City resolved this matter without conflict and has not received any complaints regarding this important issue since 2015. With the assistance of the New Hampshire Secretary of State's Office, the City has provided accessible voting machines to blind or visually impaired voters in every local, state and federal election since 2015, and will continue to do so in its elections going forward. The City is proud to lead New Hampshire municipalities in addressing this worthy endeavor which strengthens our democracy.
