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City of Concord COVID Positive Employees

Concord, NH (December 1, 2020) – On November 30, Concord Police Chief Bradley Osgood was informed that four employees tested positive for COVID-19. Employees sought testing after becoming symptomatic the week of November 22. These instances appear to be isolated, and the individuals had no contact with the public.

One Patrol Officer called into a shift following days off and subsequently tested positive for COVID-19. Another employee of the department contacted the Police Chief after testing positive during his vacation. The third employee became symptomatic after finishing his day shift on Monday, November 23, tested positive on November 29, and had not been at work since November 23. All of the employee's close contacts at work have been notified to quarantine at home. A fourth employee worked on November 16, began remote work on the 17th, and was in the office before normal business hours on the 18th and 20th, but did not have contact with other employees or the public. This employee began experiencing symptoms on the 20th, got tested on the 22nd and received a positive result on the 30th.

Additionally, one City Hall employee who has not been at work since November 20 and has had no contact with the public also tested positive for COVID-19.

The employees are currently isolating at home and recovering.
