## Barrett Moulton Named Interim Police Chief

**Concord, NH** – The City of Concord is pleased to announce that Deputy Chief Barrett J. Moulton has been named Interim Chief of the Concord Police Department effective January 24, 2026. He takes over the role as current Chief Bradley Osgood retires on January 23, 2026.

Chief Moulton has more than 27 years of experience in law enforcement. He grew up in New Hampshire and attended Northeastern University. He joined the Concord Police Department in 2006 after serving as a Police Officer and Sergeant with the Town of Loudon.

During his tenure with the Concord Police Department, Chief Moulton has worked in several positions and units including Patrol Officer, Detective with the Concord Police Drug Enforcement Unit and with the NH Attorney General’s Drug Task Force, and as a Detective in the Departments Youth Services Unit. He was promoted to Deputy Chief in 2022 and was assigned to the Department’s Bureau of Support Services overseeing the Department’s Criminal Investigations Division, Community Services Unit, and Police Social Worker Unit in 2024.

“Concord is a wonderful community, and I am honored to have this opportunity. The Concord Police Department has some of the most dedicated and talented officers and civilian staff in the state, who work diligently each day to provide the best service to our community. I look forward to collaborating with this incredible team as we move forward,” said Chief Moulton. “I would also like to express my gratitude to Chief Osgood for his 37 years of dedicated service to the city. Under his leadership, he initiated the Comfort Dog Program, established the Police Social Worker Unit, and most recently, revived our patrol K9 program. Chief Osgood also led a multi-year effort to obtain approval for a new police headquarters. These positive initiatives have laid a strong foundation for many years of success for both the department and the community as a whole.”
