Chair Diers called the meeting to order at 8:03 A.M.

1. Adoption of December 19, 2025 Minutes

Ms. Corell moved the approval of the December 19, 2025 minutes as written. Mr. Tufts seconded the motion. The motion passed by unanimous voice vote.

2. 2026 Committee Goals/ Annual Report

Chair Diers provided a review of 2019 Tree Subcommittee goals and recommended updating for 2026 and focusing on refining what this committee is already working on successfully. He suggested a goal with invasive vine outreach would be to focus in on the invasive vine fact sheet, and getting a pilot off the ground. Chair Diers suggested another goal this committee should focus on is further developing the sustainable tree program and identifying potential participants for future tree locations. He suggested the Farmer's Market was a great opportunity to educate and conduct outreach in the community for this committee's initiatives, and should continue to be a goal to focus on. He further reported the Tree Champion award has had two great events and it has contributed to raising the profile of the tree canopy in the City and it should continue to be a priority for this committee. Chair Diers further reported the focus should continue on refreshing the tree fund. He recommends continuing to work with City staff to assist in tree infrastructure throughout City projects. These goals will be put into a reference document for the committee and then added to the meeting agenda for reference.

A brief discussion ensued around tree infrastructure and urban canopy, support of the sustainable tree program, utility tree trimming/removals, and connecting with outside organizations to raise funds. Chair Diers will finalize the 2026 Tree Subcommittee Goals for the February meeting. Mr. Regan requested that a point person on the subcommittee be assigned to each goal.

3. Annual Report

Chair Diers reported an annual report has been drafted and will be submitted to City Council March meeting along with a request to transfer funds from the Urban Tree Trust Fund.

4. Follow up

2 **a. Opportunities to collaborate with Havenwood Heritage Heights**

3 Mr. Regan reported he had been in contact with CEO of Havenwood Heritage Heights (HHH) Michael Palmieri to
4 learn how their Earth Day tree donation program was organized, and how the invasive vine removal program
5 worked. In addition, they discussed possibility of utilizing volunteers of HHH for future project for invasive vine
6 removals or new tree plantings. He reported awareness of Bittersweet vines at HHH were raised by a resident
7 and Mr. Palmieri and it appears as though he outsourced removal and Mr. Regan would like to follow up to learn
8 more about the removal of the invasive vines.

9 **b. Invasive Vines - Education/Outreach**

10 Mr. Winnett reported that he and Chair Diers met to discuss invasive vines. He also spoke with Mark Feigl with
11 Merrimack River Water Shed Council whom expressed interest in working with the Tree Subcommittee to utilize
12 grant funds to remove invasive vines. Mr. Feigl reported he has access to tools for volunteers to utilize to remove
13 vines and was interested in looking at potential sites. Mr. Winnett and Chair Diers had originally discussed
14 piloting known locations such as Project See or HHH; however, HHH appears to have removed the vines and has
15 their own process. He will follow up with Mr. Feigl at a later point to discuss future sites and proper disposal of
16 vines.

17 Mr. Winnett reported he is developing an invasive vine calendar and potential messages for fact sheets to hand
18 out at the Farmers' Market.

19 Ms. Fenstermacher suggested Mr. Winnett attend a Conservation Commission meeting to learn more about what
20 they are working on.

21 Chair Diers reported having a very solid fact sheet on how to identify and remove invasive vines should be the
22 priority so it is available when meeting with the community and committee partners and then work on the
23 calendar. Councilor Brown volunteered to assist Mr. Winnett in the creation of the fact sheet and calendar before
24 May.

25 **c. Fundraising/Grant opportunities**

26 Chair Diers reported he met with the owner of Feathered Friends (FF) Tucker Jadcak to discuss the idea of a
27 fundraising opportunity. Mr. Jadcak would like to participate in a fundraiser by launching a tree beer in the
28 Spring and they will donate a dollar per beer of that batch. Mr. Jadcak suggested a launch party in the Spring
29 combined with trivia night and raffles. Chair Diers reported this will be on the February agenda to discuss
30 further.

31 Mr. Regan reported Ms. Fenstermacher will pursue the tree donation from Unitil. He also reported the State's
32 schoolyard canopy tree planting program continues to be is another option for a grant opportunity.

33 **6. New Business**

34 **a. Tree Champion Award 2026**

35 Mr. Daigle reported he will be meeting with the local Chamber of Commerce to discuss. The media materials from
36 the previous award will be updated along with the nomination form. He would like have the nomination form out
37 late March/early April and leave it open for 6 weeks for nominations and review. The winner will be selected and an
38 award ceremony would likely be for May.

39 **7. Other Business**

40 Chair Diers reported he has been Chair for the past seven years and he would like the committee members to consider a
41 new chair. He would like to remain on the subcommittee as a regular member.
