

13 ~ 15 Fayette Street



The house is now a duplex with a vernacular gable end frame with 6 by 2 bay double house with orientation on the lateral side to the street. The double entry is composed of two sets of paired doors, each with a vertical light. The entries are sheltered by a heavy, flat roofed hood supported by 3 plain scroll brackets. All the windows have molded surrounds and 2/2 window sash. The house and ell are supported by a high cut granite foundation with yard featuring a small granite retaining wall.

The house was built by James Ring about 1870, after he took title of the land from Charles West, a fellow machinist with the Concord Railroad. Later owners were Clarence Allen, a messenger with the Railroad Express Agency, and James Humphrey, a clerk at Gofkrauf's stores which sold automobile accessories. Research included the Concord Room of the Concord Library Concord Survey, City records and the Merrimack County Registry of Deeds.
