

19 Jackson Street



Research included the Merrimack County Registry of Deeds and Probate, Concord Room of the Concord Public Library and Concord City Directories, Genealogical records and Census archives.

The building is a Victorian architectural style with front gable facing the road, retaining the some porch detailing. The land was sold by Francis C. Beede to James Fury in 1871, but the house address and likely construction was completed by 1894 as the house is listed in the 1894 Concord Directory. In the 1897 Directory, Ellen Fury was noted as the owner and housekeeper by profession. In a number of mortgages and deeds granted by Ellen Fury, she is listed as the widow of James Fury. Research found that Ellen E. Fagan and James Fury were married on January 29th, 1869 in Concord, NH. Ellen was born about 1844/46 in Ireland and James was born about 1837 in Ireland. The 1900 Federal Census for Concord lists Ellen E. Fury, age 54 as a widow [of James Fury who died about 1883, age 46], head of household and living at 19 Jackson Street, Concord Ward 4. The Concord Directories from 1893-97 list Ellen as the widow of James. The year of her immigration is listed as 1850 in the 1900 Census. She is shown as living with her daughter, granddaughter, niece and nephew. Ellen died in 1926 and her Merrimack County Probate lists 4 real estate holdings including 19 Jackson Street and leaves the properties to her daughter Ellen [Fury] DeCourcy.
