## **Havenwood Heritage Heights Named 2025 Concord Tree Champion**

**Concord, NH (October 30, 2025)** – Havenwood Heritage Heights has been named the 2025 Concord Tree Champion.

The Concord Tree Champion is awarded to businesses or individuals who have made a significant contribution to the city's treescape. Havenwood Heritage Heights has made notable efforts to add trees to their Havenwood and Heritage Heights campuses during an event on Earth Day as well as throughout the year. CEO Mike Palmieri noted that the trees not only beautify their properties, but also make environmental contributions and are meaningful to their residents. Some residents lent their expertise in selecting sites and species and tree care, while others donated trees in memory of a loved one.
